Soon, very soon, the RCIA process will bring us together with new people. These people are very special because they have a strong desire to become a Catholic. Their stories are stories of Faith. The Pre-Catechumenate is the step that our Inquiries do just that; they Inquire. Inquiry discusses the basic subject most often asked Inquiries; including Mass, Catholic interpretation of the Bible, Mary, and places and practices of the Catholic Church. The second stage or step discusses more specific aspects of the faith, including the individual Sacraments, social justice, Church history, and conscience formation. Lent shows participants how to move into the purification stage through prayer and reflection. Mystagogy helps new Catholics learn more about their place in the Church by exploring ministry, spirituality, and continuing conversion.
