RELIGIOUS ED

Goals / Mission for Family Catechesis in OLMC Parish School and Religious Education Program:

- + help families learn how to pray and to discuss their faith
- And see themselves as the primary catechists
- + bring families together in order to share and deepen their Catholic faith
- + strengthen the relationship between family and Church
- + support Catholic faith practices within the family life
- + integrate the family into the parish community
- Students in Grades K – 8 (Both in OLMC School and in the School of Religion) are to participate in **five hours** of Family Catechesis every year.
- Family catechesis can be any combination model or method listed as long as it totals five hours.**

SACRAMENTAL LITURGIES: BAPTISM

The baptism of adults is a process that takes place over a long period of time, anywhere from one to three years in some places. The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults or RCIA is modeled upon the practice of the early church.

Inquirers are first interviewed so that any preliminary questions can be answered and some basic background information may be obtained. It is explained to them at that initial encounter that they are already on a spiritual journey, a pilgrimage. Their desire to consider baptism or for those already baptized in another tradition to enter into the Catholic church is itself an action of the Holy Spirit.
