Dear Friends:

Last week I spoke about vocations, dealing specifically with the vocation of the single person. This week I would like to reflect on the vocation of the married person.

Married people have an incredible contribution to make to the mission of the Church, and to the betterment of the world.

The family is the "first parish" of the parishes of the world, the little Church inside the larger Church. A better realization of the value of the vocation of parents on the part of the Church is essential in the future. All of us, bishops, priests, sisters and deacons need to improve our support for the dignity of married life. Married people are a treasure in the day to day of God's Church.
