<u>"SPIRITUAL HEALING"</u>

Dear Friends:

Every one of us has experienced illness, either with ourselves or with someone we care about. It is a part of our human experience. It can be a very difficult, and very discouraging. We all look for answers, and we all look for healing. One of the greatest religious questions is "why is there human suffering?"

If you read through the Gospels, you will see time and time again Jesus healing. He heals paralytics, the lame, lepers, as well as those possessed by evil spirits. These healings tell us many things: that Jesus has diving power, that God cares about our difficulties, that suffering can be overcome. We are encouraged by theses miracles.

When illness happens to us or to our loved ones, we obviously want miracles. Every day we pray here at Immaculate/St. Anthony for the healing of our sick parishioners. We also pray for family and friends around this area near and far. It is part and parcel of who we are as Catholics. We pray, we pray a lot, and we pray for healing and miracles. It's what we do. And it's what we should do.

We know that miracles do happen, and sometimes they don't. But we keep praying, because God wants us to and we know that it's something we should do.

But we also need to be more aware of the possibility of spiritual healing. There is a direct and strong connection between the Sacrament of the Sick and the Sacrament of Confession. That's because part of the Sacrament of the Sick is to put into effect spiritual healing. Miracles may not happen in respect to physical healing, but spiritual healing can happen more than we realize. A person's body may not be healed, but a person's soul can be healed, released from the slavery of sin and mental anguish.

Spiritual healing can happen. God wants to give us a new soul, free from the anxiety of mental and spiritual stress. All we have to do is let the Lord enter our life.

† LENTEN REGULATIONS †

Weekdays of Lent - There is no obligation to fast. However, voluntary acts of self-denial are recommended.

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday - These are days of Fast and Abstinence from meat. There is a limit of one full meal on these days for all between the ages of 18 and 59 inclusive.

<u>Days of Abstinence</u> - All Fridays in Lent. All who have reached their 14th year are bound to abstain totally from meat. Meat is considered to be the flesh and organs of mammals and fowl. You also cannot eat soups and gravies made from them. You can eat fish.

<u>Easter Duty Obligations</u> – After they have received their First Holy Communion, Catholics are bound by the obligation of receiving Holy Communion at least once a year. This precept should be fulfilled during the Easter Season. Catholics are also bound to confess serious (mortal) sins at least once a year, but this is not limited to the Lenten/Easter Season.
