Then, in the very midst of my desperation - inspiration hit. I decided to find all the words I could think of that rhymed with June and see if some idea emerged from that. The first two words I thought of were **coon** and **goon** - those didn't seem too promising. So, I started at the other end of the alphabet and the first word that popped into mind was **tune**. Guess what, that got the wheels to start turning. **Tune** reminds me of the beauty of music. It also reminds me that I should be raising my voice every day to the Lord in a song of praise. A song of gratitude for all the many blessings He has bestowed upon me. That I should continually make a joyful noise unto the Lord in worship and adoration as He is my Creator, my Redeemer and my Sanctifier. June is a wonderful time to sing a **tune** to God.

I am reminded that my faith invites me to walk in the **noon** day light that comes from a solid relationship with Jesus Christ. When I walk in the bright light of my Savior, nothing is hidden, nothing is obscured in the darkness of evil. A relationship with Jesus is the most important gift I use to stay in the light of the truth. June is a time to walk in the **noon** day light of the Lord.

Finally, there is the word **boon**. A **boon** is a favor that is given by a King or Queen to his/her people. Certainly God's Blessings to us are **boons** that we receive every day we walk through our life here on earth. Some of His **boons** include things like the seven Sacraments - in particular the Holy Eucharist and Reconciliation, the relationships He has blessed us with here on earth that support and sustain us, the many prayers we make to God that He continually answers. There are millions of **boons** that God gives us - one of our primary tasks is to share these same **boons** with others. June is a month to reach out in a blessed way, to do a favor for someone else, to help them have an easier time of it.
