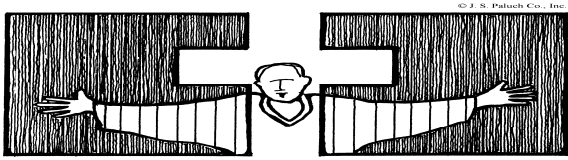

## Lectors and Eucharistic Ministers

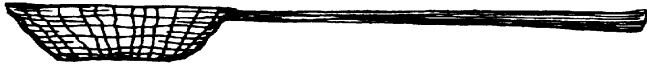

Our Mass attendance last Sunday was 1,362.

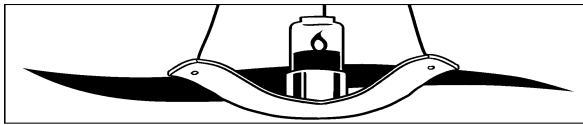

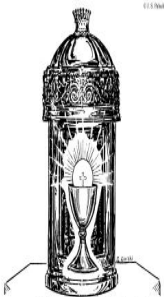
Our collection last week was \$ 7,626.00.

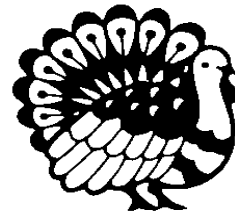
