

1 Thessalonians 1:1-5b

Staying Alive

Faith, hope and love are signs of a community alive. They show human activity inspired by God.

The first letter to the Thessalonians describes such a community. The letter was written by Paul, Silvanus, and Timothy to a church founded by word and power. The missionaries had preached the good news by their words, but the Holy Spirit had added power to their preaching. The success of this venture was evident in three ways: faith, hope, and love.

The writers of the letter give thanks to God, "unceasingly calling to mind your work of faith and labor of love and endurance in hope of our Lord Jesus Christ."


Even today, a good Christian community—whether a family or a parish—is noted by faith, hope, and love. Christians have faith in God and demonstrate that faith by their worship together and prayer in private. Faith prompts believers to work for the sake of the gospel, spreading the good news of Jesus Christ.

For Christian communities, love is a labor. It brings happiness and it starts from feelings of joy, but it demands hard work and patience. Communities thrive when the members are willing to do the hard work of love.

Hope permits endurance. Waiting for the coming of Christ, we hope in his word. That hope helps us continue when the struggle gets hard. Faith, hope, and love keep communities alive.

R.C.I.A.

This **Thursday, October 23**, Marlyn Schima will talk to our Catechumens about the Spiritual and Corporal Works of Mercy and the virtues of Faith, Hope, and Love. The following week our topic will be the Communion of Saints.

Anyone interested in beginning the process of becoming Catholic, or with questions about Catholic belief, is invited to come any Thursday at 7:30 p.m. to our Inquiry sessions. Inquiry is an open-ended small group discussion format designed to respond to questions or to begin a person's faith journey toward Catholic sacraments. Topics are determined by the interests expressed in the group.

Bible Studies

Monday Mornings: The morning group will meet this **Monday, October 20**, in the Ministry Center Library at 9:15. New participants are still welcome to join this overview of the whole Bible which will continue until Easter. Each session consists of a video presentation and discussion.

Tuesday evenings: This **Tuesday, October 21**, we continue our *Beginners* Introduction to the Bible. This class is best for those wanting to get started reading Scripture who have not participated in a Bible Study group previously. We will talk about how to read and interpret the scriptures, how to locate texts in the Bible, and the meanings of the stories found throughout the scriptures. This group will meet on Tuesday evenings from 7:30 to 9 p.m. in the Ministry Center Library

Wednesday evenings: On **Wednesday, October 22**, we will continue our 8-week Bible Study on the Prophets of the Old Testament. We will continue to reflect upon the relationship between the Prophets and the Kings of Israel from David to the Babylonian exile, and how the religion of the Israelites continued to develop through Divine revelation and the preaching of the Prophets. This week we will look at the prophetic writings of the pre-exilic Isaiah. This group meets on Wednesday evenings from 7:30 to 9 p.m. in the Ministry Center Library.

Prayer & Meditation with Scripture

Our prayer group will gather in the Blessed Sacrament Chapel this **Tuesday, October 21**. This hour of prayer time utilizes varying prayer forms each week. It is a time to meet with others in quiet and peace away from the busyness and noise of the world. We gather for prayer in the Blessed Sacrament Chapel at 7:30 p.m.

Wondering Why

The first reading today, from Isaiah 45, indicates a major change in the theological understanding of ancient Israel, but to understand its impact we need a little bit of background.

First, the Hebrew and later the Israelite people went through a long process in understanding God's revelation. When God first

revealed himself to Abraham, he was speaking to a man from a culture which believed in many gods. Abraham chose to follow this one unknown God who had called him, but neither he nor the Hebrew people at that time understood that no other gods existed.

Over the centuries, devotion to the God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob grew within the Israelite community. They moved from being a polytheistic culture to being a henotheistic one. That means that while they still believed that other gods existed, they were dedicated to the worship of only the God of their ancestors.

It was not until the end of the Babylonian exile that God revealed to his people that he was the Only God. We see that revelation reflected in this writing from Isaiah, which dates from the late 6th century, near the end of the exile and the return of the people to Judah.

Another aspect of God is revealed in this prophecy also, that God can work through other people besides the Israelites, or Jews as they would be known after their return to Jerusalem. Through Isaiah, God speaks of "his anointed, Cyrus." In Hebrew, the word anointed means messiah, one who is chosen for a special role. In the ancient world, prophets, priests and kings were anointed and considered messiahs. For the Jews, these persons had always been chosen from among their own people. Now, something new is happening. Cyrus is not a Jew. He is a Persian King, related neither ethnically nor religiously to the Jewish people. That scripture should refer to him as "a messiah" is astounding, and a major departure from their understanding of the Elect, or those chosen by God.

Cyrus was an enlightened leader for his time. Rather than keeping conquered people captive and resettling them in new territories in order to dilute their tribal bonds, Cyrus believed that the cultures and religions of peoples should be preserved. As King, he gave the Jewish people, who had been conquered by the Babylonians 50 years earlier and taken out of their land, permission to return to Jerusalem. He even provided them with funds to rebuild their temple. From the Jewish perspective, Cyrus was certainly an agent of their God. He was acting through the grace of God to reestablish God's Chosen people in their own land and rebuild their sacred place of worship.

So, in this reading, we see the beginnings of a new theology for the Jews. They become at this time a monotheistic people, believing that only One God exists, the God who had centuries before revealed himself to Abraham, and given the Covenant to Moses. They also began to understand that God is not limited, but can choose anyone, of any nation, to be his agent. God's chosen ones are not just of one nation or race, but rather people whose hearts are open to hear the word of God and act upon it.



Ministerio Hispano

Reflexionemos sobre la Palabra de Dios

En una nación, que tiene un fuerte compromiso con el principio de la separación de Iglesia y Estado, vale la pena señalar que nuestra moneda nacional, tanto los billetes como las monedas, tienen la inscripción de "En Dios confiamos". La historia de este lema y su relación con nuestra moneda nacional se remonta a la Guerra Civil. Cambiar el lema nunca ha recibido mucho apoyo. Esa inscripción nos sirve como buen recordatorio en cuanto a dónde es que descansa nuestra verdadera seguridad.

En el Evangelio los fariseos, junto a algunos simpatizantes con el régimen romano y partidarios de Herodes, tratan de atrapar a Jesús para que tome una posición que lo pondría a mal con las autoridades romanas o con su propio pueblo. Pero Jesús, aun sabiendo la reputación de zorro que tenía Herodes, se zafa de las redes de sus adversarios haciendo notar que pueden haber diferentes clases de fidelidades sin perder las prioridades.

Jesús les pide que le enseñen la moneda idólatra que ningún judío debía llevar consigo, ya que declaraba al César como un dios. Entonces les aconseja que le devuelvan al emperador la moneda que lleva su imagen, pero que le devuelvan a Dios aquello que lleva la imagen de Dios, esto es, ellos mismos, creados a imagen de Dios.

Un nuevo orden se manifiesta cuando le entregamos a Dios su imagen por medio de nuestras palabras y obras, mostrando así la imagen de Dios a los demás. Cuando esto sucede, el lema de "En Dios confiamos" no sólo lo vemos acuñado en papel o herrado en cobre, sino que lo llegamos a palpar en carne y hueso.


