Reflecting on God's Word

Twenty-Eighth Sunday

in Ordinary Time

When the rich young man in this week's Gospel asks Jesus what he must *do* to inherit eternal life, the answer is simply "nothing." Or to put it another way, "You don't have to *do* anything to earn it. Simply *do not* let anything get in the way. Don't kill, or commit adultery, or steal, or lie, or defraud, or any such things that tend to muddy the focus of our lives."

Beyond that it seems we don't have to *do* anything. But, the young man protests, he has avoided all these things. And so the reply Jesus then offers is, in effect, don't let your riches get in the way either.

Easier said than done, and more difficult than imagined. More difficult than threading a needle with camel hair when the hair is still on the camel; more difficult than getting a camel inside your house, whether through your pet door or your back door or maybe even your garage door. Camels don't shrink. Neither does our hold on riches. Both tend to get in the way.

So what does one then do, we ask. Curious—that was the same response in Jesus' day as well. And over the centuries believers have sought ways to keep wealth in perspective, or at least some things that might help do so. Yet it's all about trying to make sure that as little as possible gets in the way of finding God among the mishmash of life.

R.C.I.A.

At our RCIA sessions this **Thursday, October 15**, Charlene Dumitru will present an Introduction to the Old Testament. The following week our topic will be Redemption.

Anyone desiring to become a Catholic is welcome to begin the Inquiry Process on Thursday evenings at 7:30. Inquiry sessions are available year-round, except for holidays, and new participants are welcome at any time. Whether you have decided to become a Catholic, wish to learn more about the Church, or just have questions that you would like to discuss, we encourage you to join us. There is no obligation at this stage of the RCIA process, but for those who desire to continue to the reception of sacraments, the process usually takes a minimum of one year.

Faith Formation: Church History

Our series on Church History will continue on **Wednesday, October 14**. The topics that evening will be **American Catholicism** and **The Church in the Age of Reason**. The history of our church is very rich and filled with fascinating events and personalities. Please join us any week in the Ministry Center Library from 7:30 to 9 p.m.

What was Happening in the Fourth Century?

The concern over reconciling *lapsi* became more complicated if the apostate had been a bishop, priest or deacon before renouncing their faith. If that person were reconciled to the Church, would they still hold the office to which they had been ordained? Again, the bishops were in disagreement. Some felt that forgiveness was total, everything, including the man's position in the Church was restored. Others felt that by denying his faith the person, even though repentant, had lost the right to serve in a sacred role, and therefore could not reassume his office and duties.

As bishops and priests who had completed canonical penance began to reassume their offices, a schism developed between those who felt this return to sacred service was proper, and those who emphatically did not. The matter was exacerbated, probably unintentionally, by the Emperor Constantine who gave money to the churches who received back their apostate clergy with full reinstatement, and did not provide funds to those churches which did not.

Those against re-admittance to Holy Orders were rigorists who believed the Church was to be a community of "saints" and not one of "sinners." They taught that if a bishop or priest who had committed apostasy or another grave sin were to celebrate a sacrament, that sacrament would be invalid because of the unworthiness of the minister. This was problematic, because it was impossible for a Christian to know whether the clergy ministering to him, saying mass, baptizing, were indeed in a state of grace, or not. Even if a particular priest or bishop was worthy, if the bishop who had ordained him had been unworthy, then the ordination itself was invalid, and therefore any sacraments that followed.

The majority of Catholic Bishops, however, held that the sacraments were effective in and of themselves, and not dependent upon the holiness of the minister. They said that the true minister of the sacraments, and the only true priest was Jesus Christ himself, and that all other ordained persons were vessels through whom Christ worked, and who shared in his priesthood, and that the validity of the sacraments depended upon the holiness of Christ alone, which never changes, and not upon the holiness of any man.

The issue became especially heated in North Africa, when in 311 Caecilian was appointed Bishop of Carthage. Caecilian had been consecrated a Bishop by Bishop Felix of Aprungi who was allegedly an apostate who had reconciled with the Church. This claim was never proven to be true; but it was believed nonetheless. In response, those who opposed Caecilian selected Bishop Donatus Magnus.

This rigorist movement to define the validity of the sacraments based on the worthiness of the minister was declared a heresy in 313 AD at a local council held in Rome at the request of Emperor Constantine. The heresy was called by the name of the rebel bishop Donatus, and those who followed him were known as Donatists. The Donatists appealed to Constantine, and the next year a larger council was held in Arles to hear the matter. Again the Church ruled against the Donatists. After a third appeal, Constantine demanded that all parties appear directly before him. After hearing the petitions, Constantine ruled in favor of Bishop Caecilian and against Bishop Donatus, warning that the growing unrest over the matter in Carthage be settled and no riots or violence was to be tolerated. Carthage did, however erupt into violence, and further imperial injunctions were placed upon the Donatists, who saw this action as a new persecution against them.

Although the Donatist movement had been declared heretical by the Catholic Bishops, and condemned by the Emperor himself, it persisted. Augustine wrote about them in the early fifth century, and in 409 AD, Bishop Marcellinus of Carthage, a successor of Caecilian, again condemned them as heretics. The heresy did not entirely disappear until after the Arab conquests in the 7th and 8th centuries.

As serious as the Donatist heresy was, another greater heresy was developing which was to rip the fourth century Church in two.

And, so, the history of the Church continues...

Reflexionemos sobre la Palabra de Dios

Vigésimo Octavo Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario

Cuando el joven rico en el Evangelio de esta semana le pregunta a Jesús qué debe *hacer* para alcanzar la vida eterna la respuesta es sencillamente “nada”. O diciéndolo con otras palabras, “No tienes que *hacer* nada para ganártela; sencillamente *no hagas* nada que le ponga obstáculos. No mates, no cometas adulterio, no robes, no mientas, no defraudes, ni hagas ninguna otra cosa que tienda a enturbiar el epicentro de nuestra vida”. Parece que no tenemos que *hacer* más nada que eso. Pero el joven dice que ya él ha evitado todas esas cosas. Y la respuesta que le ofrece Jesús es, en efecto, que tampoco deje que sus riquezas le obstaculicen el camino.

Pero del dicho al hecho hay un gran trecho y el hecho es más difícil de lo que podemos imaginar. Más difícil que ensartar una aguja con pelo de camello cuando el pelo todavía está en el camello; más difícil que hacer que el camello entre en tu casa, ya sea por la puertecita de tu mascota o por tu puerta trasera, o ni aun por la puerta de tu cochera. Los camellos no se encojen; ni tampoco nuestro apego a las riquezas. Ambas cosas tienden a obstaculizar el camino.

Entonces, ¿qué hacer?, nos preguntamos. Curiosamente ésa era la misma pregunta también en los tiempos de Jesús. Y a través de los siglos los creyentes han buscado las maneras de poner las riquezas en perspectiva o al menos encontrar cosas que ayuden a hacerlo. Sin embargo, todo lo que hay que hacer es tratar de que haya los menos obstáculos posibles en nuestro camino hacia el encuentro con Dios, aun en medio de los revoltijos de la vida.


