## FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK:

In the course of His life, Jesus often posed questions. Some were posed to the crowds, some to the Pharisees and many to his own disciples. Some of the questions were rhetorical, meaning they were asked to make a point and not necessarily to get an answer. In the Gospel this week we hear Jesus asking, "Who do people say that I am?" The answers showed the confusion in the minds of many who identified Him with the Baptist or one of the prophets. Then the Lord asks His disciples directly, "But who do you say that I am?" It is Peter who responds, "You are the Christ." This is a question Jesus poses to us as well. It requires a continual response as we live out our call to discipleship. This response demands our ongoing efforts in life to recognize who Jesus is and what following Him entails. This question requires not a one-time answer but an answer that continues each day of our lives. If the Lord asked you today "who do YOU say that I am," how would we respond?

As you may have noticed there are serious issues with our sound system in the Church. At several Masses recently, it had to be turned off due to excessive noise. The system is old and beyond repair. I am in contact with the company that does sound work in most of the churches here in New York. As soon as I get an evaluation and proposal I will share it with you. I hope we will be able to raise the necessary funds for the replacement.

## WORDS OF INSPIRATION:

### **The Kingdom Come**

Up to this point in Mark's Gospel, neither Jesus nor his followers have used any of Jesus' "titles" familiar to Christians. Jesus' identity as the Messiah and Son of God was not part of Jesus' message in Mark. Jesus did not proclaim himself as "The Messiah" or "the Son of God," and did not call people to believe that he was. This does not mean that it is wrong for Christians to call Jesus by these titles—after all, that is who he is for us. But it does mean that Jesus' message in our earliest gospel is not about believing a set of statements about him but about the coming of God's kingdom, conveyed in stories about exorcisms, teaching, healing, parables, feeding, conflict and "the way."
