FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK:

This Sunday we hear St. Luke's version of what are commonly known as The Beatitudes. You will notice right away that they are somewhat different than the more familiar version we hear in the Gospel of St. Matthew. Matthew lists a series of blessings while Luke lists a series of blessings followed by a series of woes. Both versions of the Beatitudes try to convey the same message. Those who are deprived or suffering now in any way will experience happiness and blessing in the future. Those who are self-satisfied and seemingly prosperous now will see their situation reversed.

The Beatitudes set a pattern for our lives as followers of Christ. To the world they probably don't make sense any more than they did when Jesus first spoke them. To people of faith they make a great deal of sense. They focus our attention not so much on the here and now but rather point us to what lies ahead.

I thank all who recently contributed to our Food Drive. There was such a tremendous response and so many people will be assisted through your generosity. The Community Center said it was the largest response they have had from any parish. Thanks to all who were so generous and to all who worked so hard to bring it all together.

Feed Our Neighbors Food Drive News:

St. Patrick's very generous contribution of **431** bags of food containing an estimated **5,200** pounds of food filled the shelves at the Community Center of Northern Westchester. The food donations covered all four food groups and included everything from anchovies to ziti!!

We distributed almost 1,000 bags to CCD students, CYO basketball players (all 27 teams) and our parishioners. These bags were generously donated by the following stores: DeCicco's in Katonah, Key Foods in Bedford, ShopRite in Bedford Hills, Stop & Shop in Mt. Kisco and Whole Foods in Chappaqua. The (Scotts Corners) Market in Pound Ridge Square donated bags and a van/driver to the food drive.

The Community Center of Northern Westchester needs volunteers for its food pantry, clothing boutique and instructors for classes. Please stop by and see this amazing operation. Nothing is wasted; everything is recycled. Possibly you have a skill or ability that can help!

It is our hope that a larger group of parishioners will recommit to donating food on the first weekend of the month. This will allow the Community Center to reallocate its resources consistently and offer more classes that will eventually result in a shortened food line.
