Pastoral Reflection

Tips about Prayer, part 1

“O Lord, hear my prayer. O Lord, hear my prayer. When I call, answer me.” (Thomas Merton)

THE BEST WAY TO LEARN HOW TO PRAY IS TO PRAY.

Prayer isn't complicated. We are made for prayer and everyone is a "natural" when it comes to prayer. We just need to do it.

PRAYER SHOULD BE ENJOYABLE.

Find a pleasant place to pray, a comfortable chair, a candle. Find a form of prayer you enjoy.

DON'T BE AFRAID TO PRAY "YOUR FEELINGS."

It is not how you are supposed to feel, it is how do you feel? Prayer is not an exchange of information. It is intimacy and sharing feelings. Talk straight to God about everything.

IT IS OFTEN HARD TO GET STARTED.

Even when you discover that prayer is enjoyable, it is sometimes hard to get started. You have to find time and push yourself to start.

REGULAR PRAYER CAN HELP A LOT.

If it is hard to find the time and get yourself to do it, join a group that gathers to pray. It might be the incentive you need.

DON'T PASS UP UNEXPECTED OR UNSCHEDULED MOMENTS OF PRAYER. Sometimes, without intending it, we naturally drift into prayer. It comes upon us at an unexpected moment. Go with it, however brief. Many of the best prayer experiences happen this way.

SOMETHING DOESN'T HAVE TO "HAPPEN" EVERY TIME WE PRAY.

Prayer is "being with God". The results are real but gradual. Every session of prayer is not meant to produce a new thought, a new resolution, or bottom line result.

A PRAYER FOR EVERY DAY

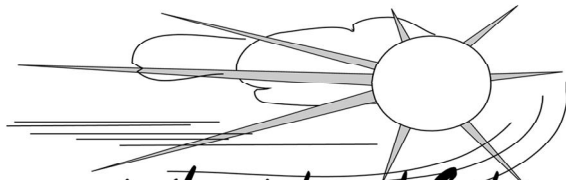

Like every other day, Lord, you offer to: walk by my side, shelter my heart, enlighten my thoughts, forgive my sins and wash me in mercy...

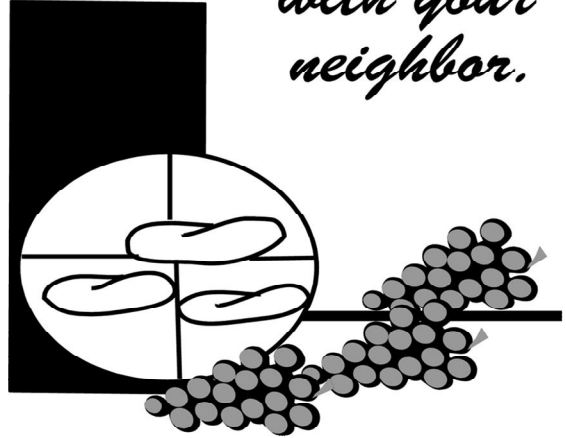
Like every other day, Lord, I can choose: to waste all you generously offer or accept and share the gifts I receive...
