Holiness

A Gift and a Task

For the past several weeks, I have been writing about Pope Francis's exhortation to holiness. In this column, I would like to speak about two aspects holiness: (1) holiness as a gift that God has *already* bestowed on us in Christ, and (2) holiness as a task to which those who have received the gift are called.

Holiness is a *gift* and a *task*. Most people, however, think of holiness as a merely a task: something they must achieve by living a good life that includes various spiritual practices. But there is another aspect to holiness that precedes the task of becoming holy: the gift of holiness.

In his letters, Saint Paul regularly calls those to whom he writes 'the saints' or 'the holy ones,' those who have been consecrated and set aside by God for service. Paul addresses his converts in this way because God has already communicated holiness to them through the blood of Jesus. In doing this, Saint Paul is affirming that holiness is a gift we have received from God.

Paul was not naïve. He experienced many problems with his converts, and their behavior was not always the conduct of saints. He calls them saints, nevertheless, because they have been sanctified, consecrated, and made holy in Christ. Paul knows this because he is deeply aware of the holiness that God granted him in Christ: God consecrated, sanctified, and made him holy, and set him aside for the proclamation of the gospel.

The gift of holiness precedes the task of holiness. We are called to be holy because we have been made holy. We are holy because we have been set aside, consecrated, sanctified by Christ's death and resurrection. And because we have received the gift of holiness we are to live lives of holiness that reflect the gift we have received.

Notice what Saint Paul writes in 1 Thessalonians, 'This is the will of God, your holiness: that you refrain from immorality ... For God did not call us to impurity but to holiness' (1 Thess. 4.3, 7). Paul reminds us that the goal of our life in Christ is 'to be blameless in holiness before our God and Father at the coming of our Lord Jesus with all his holy ones' (1 Thess. 3.13).

Because holiness is central to the Christian life, Paul is always disturbed by the presence of immoral people in the community of faith because such people defile the holiness that was bestowed upon the community at the price of Christ's blood. Accordingly, he commands the Corinthians to expel the immoral person in their midst (1 Cor. 5.1-5). And in 2 Corinthians he warns the Corinthians not to be yoked with unbelievers, 'For what partnership do righteousness and lawlessness have? Or, what fellowship does light have with darkness?' (2 Cor. 6.14).

The community of the church is a holy place because God has made it holy through the death and resurrection of Christ. The members of the church are holy because they have been made holy. *You are holy because you have been baptized into Christ.* Our *task* of living a life of holiness is grounded in the *gift* of holiness that has been bestowed in Christ.
