From the Pastor: Next Sunday, we will be taking a second collection for the benefit of the victims of Hurricane Maria and the Mexican Earthquake. Everyone has been generous in giving to the first two disaster collections. This is the third unexpected collection. I realize that all may not be able to give financially; please support them with your prayers.

Thursday, October 19 was the feast day of the North American Martyrs: six priests and two lay brothers, all members of the Society of Jesus, who were martyred by the Huron Indians during the 17th century in what is now New York and Ontario. They lived as the Apostles did bringing the Gospel to foreign lands and paying for it with their lives. St John de Brebeuf explained what motivated him in his diary. The following is excerpted from *The Liturgy of the Hours*:

My God, it grieves me greatly that you are not known, that in this savage wilderness all have not been converted to you, that sin has not been driven from it. My God, even if all the brutal tortures which prisoners in this region must endure should fall on me, I offer myself most willingly to them and I alone shall suffer them all.
