Do confessed sins affect priest/penitent relationships?

How does a priest keep the confession of a grievous sin by someone he knows from affecting his relationship with that person?

One of a priest's most sacred responsibilities is the confidentiality of the confessional. This confidentiality encompasses everyone, even the priest and penitent outside the confessional. A priest is not allowed to discuss the confessed sin with the person outside the confessional unless permission is granted for further counseling.

The confessor is also forbidden to use any knowledge gained through the sacrament of reconciliation to restrict the penitent. For instance, if a pastor's bookkeeper confessed he was embezzling money, the pastor could not use the knowledge acquired in the confessional to fire the person.

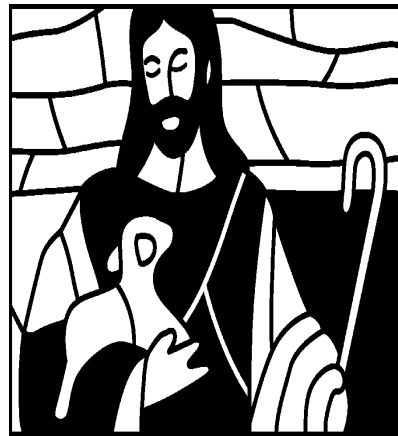
Priests generally try to forget the specific sins parishioners confess to us, and it really isn't that difficult. Contrary to what many think, a parishioner's sins do not rush into my mind when I speak to him or her.

We have *all* sinned, done things we are ashamed of, things we wouldn't want anyone to know about, things we would not want others to define us by. This knowledge and the grace of the sacrament help us look past the mistakes of others and recognize Christ within them.
