TODAY ---- Father Melesio Espinoza will be here to raise money for his school in Nicaragua. A second collection will be taken after Communion. **I was hungry, and you gave me food... (Matthew 25:35)** In 2007 Hurricane Felix indiscriminately struck the Atlantic Coast of Nicaragua in Central America. Five different ethnic groups live in this region and it is the poorest region in Nicaragua. The path of the hurricane destroyed 80% of the communities, and in particular levelled houses, schools, clinics, and churches. Father Melesio Peter Espinoza and Mons. Tom Frank, who were both working at the Parish of San José in Austin, formed a Christian committee of solidarity called Amigos y Hermanos de Nicaragua (Friends and Brothers of Nicaragua) to help the affected área. At that time four parishes generously helped us with their second collections: San José Parish in Austin, Dolores Parish in Austin, San Francisco Parish in Austin, Santa María Asunción Parish in West Thanks be to God that with all of your help, we raised \$44,000. With those funds we constructed nine new homes in one of the communities called Santa Marta, with each home costing \$4,500. Based on this disaster, Father Tom and I decided to found "La Fundación Pro-Moskitia" (or the Pro-Moskitia Foundation), which is a non-governmental organization (501C) with its base in Austin, Texas, to continue supporting and working in the affected área. After buidling the houses, we decided to work on fortifying education, considering that it is the key to change in any society. We picked five primary schools and three junior highs of different communities, to sponsor training sessions for teachers who were not fully qualified to teach their assigned subjects. We also

helped the students with school supplies, such as notebooks, pencils, and backpacks, and we helped form small community libraries. **Future plan** To construct a special junior high for honors students for indigenous youths in the area. This school will provide special training for the region's most talented young people. Thanks be to God that a family has donated two acres of land. We would appreciate your donations to help pay for the construction of the buildings. How to report an incident of concern

The Diocese of Austin is committed to preventing harm from happening to any of our children or vulnerable adults. If you are aware of sexual or physical abuse and/or neglect of a child or vulnerable adult, state law requires you to report that information to local law enforcement or the Texas Department of Family and Protective Services at (800) 252-5400 or www.dfps.state.tx.us. Additionally, if the suspected abuse is by clergy or an employee or volunteer of any diocesan parish, school, or agency, a Notice of Concern should be submitted to the diocesan Ethics and Integrity in Ministry Office at (512) 949-2400. The Notice of Concern can be found at www.austindiocese.org (click on the link HOW TO REPORT ABUSE). Reports may be made anonymously.
