Dying With Jesus

Jesus seems to overturn our expectations. We look for one who will save us from the predicaments in which we find ourselves, and he comes to us as one who seems to be a victim of his own predicament. It is no wonder that we think there must be some mistake. Even the one who cries out in faith, "You are the Christ," can insist that there must be another way. Because of this thinking, that person must be rebuked: "You are thinking not as God does, but as human beings do." How does God think? God's thinking seems to be the reverse of ours: Those who save their lives lose them; those who lose their lives save them; the seed must die before it can bear fruit: Jesus will be killed but will then be raised from the dead.
