The first is All Saints Day on November 1. **This is a holy day of obligation** when the Church celebrates the lives of all the saints who now dwell in heaven. The Church rejoices in their witness to the faith and seeks their prayers that all people may join them in the presence of God.

A **plenary indulgence** may be granted for a soul in **Purgatory** if one **visits a church on All Souls' Day and recites the Our Father and the Creed or visits a cemetery and prays for the departed on any day from November 1 to November 8**. The usual conditions for a plenary indulgence apply.
