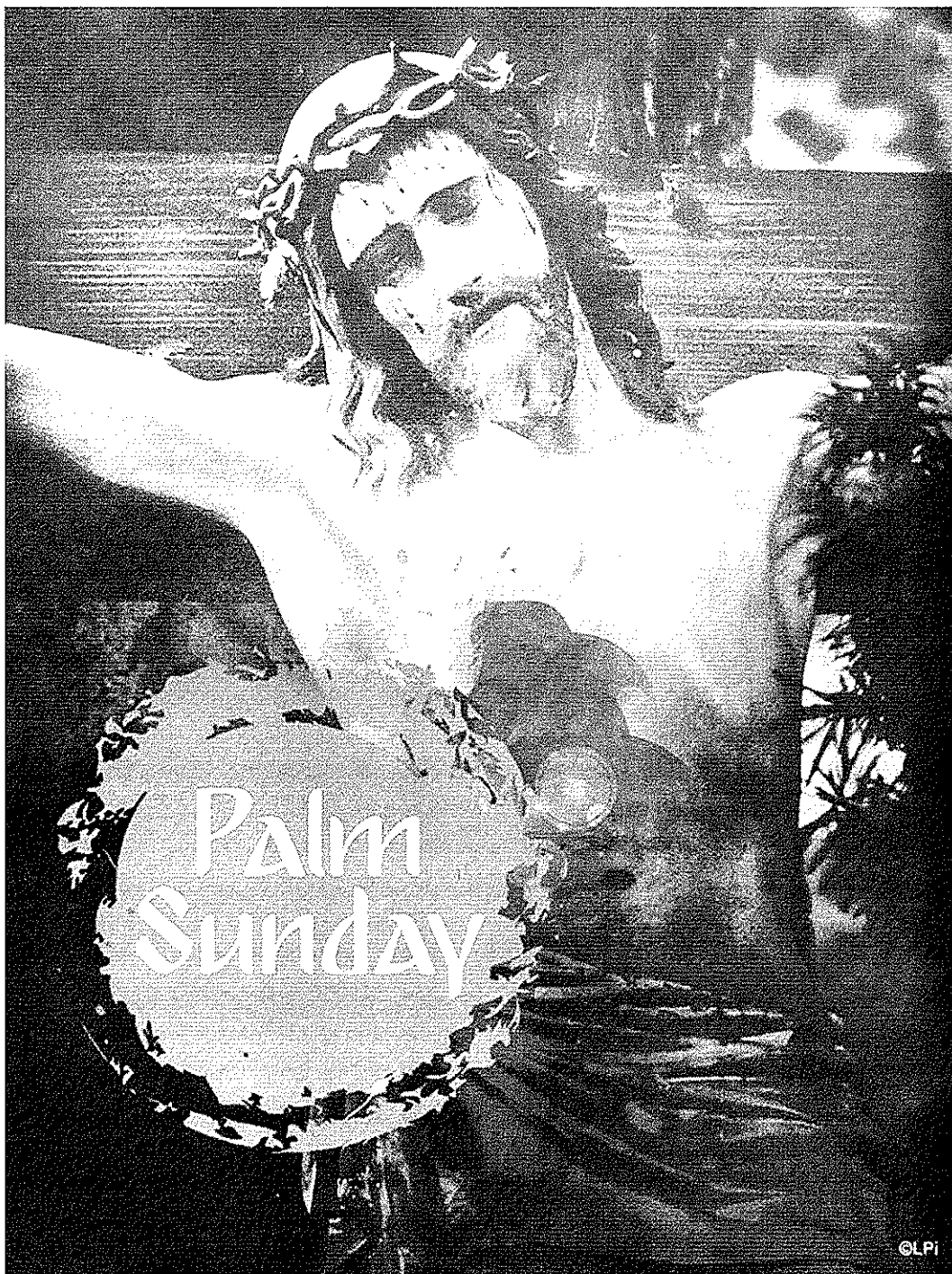

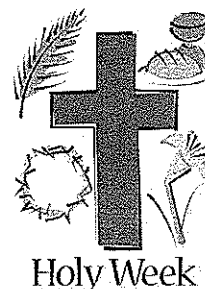

From the Desk of Father Kevin**Lent brings us to Easter:
God working with our human condition!**

Jesus shared with us all our basic human vulnerabilities: he would mature in a human family and have to grow in wisdom and age. He would experience successes and failures in his human relationships. There would be things that would console him and circumstances that would bring him to desolation. Was Jesus totally abandoned in the end? Civil authority turned against him and exercised capital punishment. Religious authority abused its role and power. His disciples would take off ~ abandoning him to endure the ordeal presumably alone. Life, as human beings know it, does end. Some people would say that the fate of every human being is to die alone.

But was it Jesus' experience to die alone? Was it his experience that he was totally betrayed and abandoned with no one able to address the impending disaster of death? The answer of Holy Week and Easter to these questions is: NO! Never did Jesus lose sight of his Father's love for him. Never did he allow any disappointment, any temptation, any disaster or any threat to separate him from what he knew about himself and his Father's love for him. He did not die alone. He knew at the core of his being that he and his Father were one. It was this confidence that allowed him to enter fully and intensely into our human experience. He demonstrated confidence in his Father by being executed as a slave ~ victimized by a world that knew not its Savior. Again the blindness of the human condition chose to "fix a broken world" by projecting the problems of the world on that which saves it. How much more absurd can it get?

But the chaos and absurdity of the human condition does not defeat the love of God for us. God's will can even use our chaotic lives and the absurdity of our human condition to bring us salvation. And so we enter the dynamics of Jesus' life this Holy Week. But at the same time we enter the dynamics of each of our lives. God rescues us using the very human condition of his Son Jesus and our own human condition to bring us to eternal life.

From the Desk of Deacon Bob

We enter Holy Week through this Palm/Passion Sunday. Throughout this week, we will be immersed into the "Paschal Mystery" of Jesus Christ. What do these words mean? The Paschal Mystery means the passion, the death, and the resurrection of Jesus Christ. The Paschal Mystery does not only apply to Jesus. It applies to us as well. St. Paul tells us that when we were baptized our lives were immersed into the Paschal Mystery of Jesus. Within the events of our lives, all of us will experience the suffering, the dying, and the rising of the Paschal Mystery not just once but numerous times. The Paschal Mystery is present in the losses of our lives, e.g. injury and sickness, unemployment, divorce, the death of someone significant to name a few. The Paschal Mystery is also present in the joys of our lives, e.g. weddings, the birth of children and grandchildren, and anniversaries.

The Paschal Mystery teaches us that the path to the resurrection is always through the cross. This flies in contradiction to the thought of many in our present age who want the resurrection without any crosses. It is the crosses in our lives that give meaning to the resurrection. It is the crosses in our lives that shape and mold us and teach us the difference between that which is essential to eternal life and that which is not. However, we must not make the mistake to emphasize the cross and ignore the resurrection. As we pass through the "crosses" of our lives, we are to focus our gaze not on the crosses that we bear but, rather, the resurrection that awaits us. This is the lesson of Holy Week. As Jesus entered into his passion and death, his eyes were focused always on the resurrection that was to come. As we continue our Lenten journey with its sacrifices, may our eyes always be focused on the promise of what is to come, namely, Easter.

Summer Stretch is going to Second Stork

On June 28th to pack layettes and diapers for newborns in need! *Why Second Stork?* Each year, thousands of new parents across Minnesota are stretched to bring their baby home from the hospital without even the most basic supplies such as a safe place to sleep, diapers, wet wipes, clothing, receiving blankets, and other essential items. Founded in 2009, Second Stork is a Minnesota non-profit that fulfills this real, immediate need by providing those critical items free of charge with no strings attached.

Items in critical need now are:

* **Sleepers** ~ one-piece, footed sleepers in sizes **Preemie (P), Newborn (NB), or 0-3 months** (size 3 months is OK too, *but 3-6 months is too big*)

* **Onesies** ~ one-piece t-shirt/bodysuit in sizes **Preemie (P), Newborn (NB), or 0-3 months** (size 3 months is OK too, *but 3-6 months is too big*)

* **Receiving Blankets** ~ Light blankets, cotton or flannel only.

* **Diapers**, as you can imagine, are also a critical part of the items provided to families in need. Second Stork provides diaper packs in addition to the layettes. We need sizes ~ **Preemie, Size 1 or Newborn.**

All donated items must be new, as hospitals cannot distribute used items. Only the sizes specified above should be collected, as these items are essential for the first 30 days; many infants wear these items home from the hospital. Contact Pamela for more information.

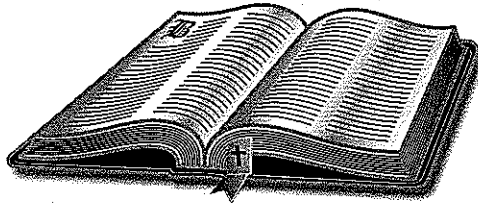

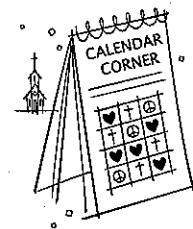
