**A Message Regarding Care for Creation...**

"A hired man, who is not a shepherd and whose sheep are not his own...works for pay and has no concern for the sheep."

"I am the good shepherd...and I will lay down my life for the sheep."

Jesus cares, not just about our eternal salvation, but about our lives here on earth, as evidenced by the healing and compassion he showed us as he walked among us. He cares for all, the greatest and especially the least. As disciples, we are challenged to care for our brothers and sisters as well. It's not enough for us to take our "pay" in our comforts and privileges with no concern for others. This has implications that are not easy to respond to seriously.

Today is Earth Day, when we are reminded once again of our duty to care for our planet and its inhabitants. It's been three years since Pope Francis challenged us, in his encyclical *Laudato Si: on Care for our Common Home*, to engage in serious dialogue about how we are shaping the future of our planet. He calls the Church and the world to acknowledge the urgency of our environmental challenges and to take action.

How much progress have we made? We continue to make strides in technology and energy sources that will reduce our carbon footprint in the future, but scientists are concerned that time is running out to avoid major consequences of climate change. Have we concern for the "sheep," the poor of the world who will suffer the most impact from rising sea waters, droughts bringing water and food shortages, major storms with their destructive impacts? It can seem hopeless.

There are little things we can do, of course, and the bulletin cover offers a host of suggestions. We can also support organizations like Catholic Relief Services, which aides people who suffer from natural disasters and helps with implementation of sustainable practices in developing nations. Another important way to respond is to let our elected officials know how critical it is for our state and nation to take seriously our response to the threats of climate change.

The changes we make in our lifestyle, the time we take to inform ourselves and contact our legislators, the generosity we show in sharing our gifts, these are all ways we can "lay down our life" for our fellow human beings on earth.

*From Laudato Si: The poor and the earth are crying out. O Lord, seize us with your power and light, help us to protect all life, to prepare for a better future, for the coming of your Kingdom of justice, peace, love and beauty. Praise be to you!*

### From the Desk of Deacon Bob

Have you ever felt abandoned? I have known many people who have felt abandoned. Abandonment comes in many forms. When a spouse dies, the widow or widower experiences not only grief of losing someone they loved, but also the feeling of being left all alone. There is the loneliness of being the sole surviving sibling of a family. There are those going through separation and divorce who experience not only being abandoned by their ex-spouse, but also by many of their family and friends. There are many children, caught in the world of foster homes, who feel abandoned and unwanted. There are those children and adolescents who are so cruelly bullied and abandoned by their peers that they opt to die by suicide.

Abandonment is the curse of a society that glorifies the individual to the point of narcissism. We find that our world of "me first and the heck with everybody else", condemns many to a life of loneliness and neglect. The readings for today are a much needed comfort for all who feel lonely and abandoned.

In John's first letter he writes, "See what love the Father has bestowed on us that we may be called the children of God." Though we may feel unloved and abandoned by all in our life, God loves us as His very own children. The bond of love that God has for us can never be severed. Paul expresses this in his letter to the Romans, "What can separate us from the love of God?" Paul answers the question saying that no matter what may happen to us, absolutely nothing can separate us from the love of God. Today, Jesus tells us that the love relationship we have with him is as intimate as the relationship he has with the Father. "I am the good shepherd, and I know mine and mine know me, just as the Father knows me and I know the Father; and I will lay down my life for the sheep."

Though we may feel abandoned and unloved, Jesus, abandoned and betrayed by those he loved, knows our pain and assures us that his love relationship with us remains for all eternity.

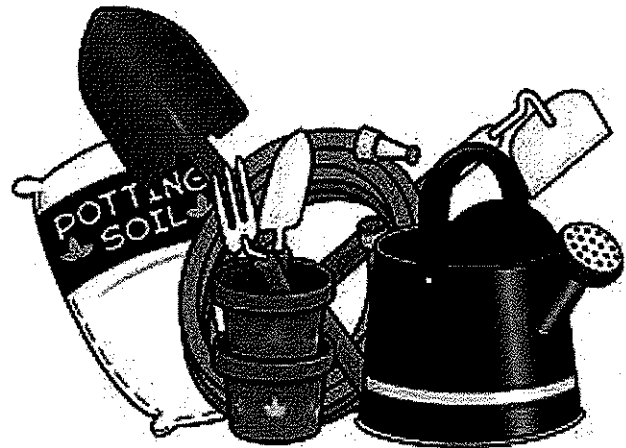

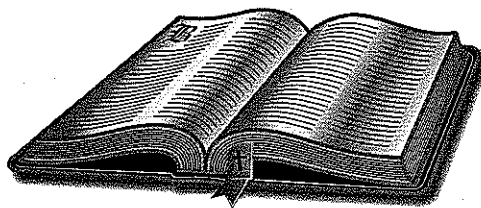

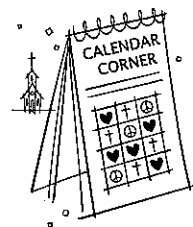
