El Salvador. With a population of 6+ million living in a region smaller than Massachusetts, CRS serves about 20,000 people. Working there since 1960, CRS has helped response and reconstruction efforts to assist Salvadorans affected by years of civil war and earthquakes, hurricanes and tropical storms. They work to mitigate youth unemployment/inactivity, high levels of violence among youth, and alternatives to migration for young people. In agriculture, CRS encourages crop diversification, soil and water conservation, reforestation and reintroducing the pre-colonial crop, cacao, for the sale of quality chocolate. They also have projects for health - HIV and AIDS, and microfinance.

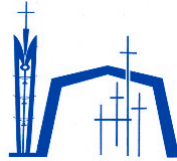

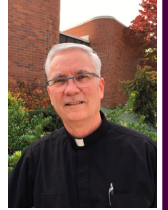

A Word from Father...

Dear Friends,

March Madness is upon us!

Anybody in Spokane who doesn't know what "March Madness" is all about must be living inside an impermeable bubble! With our own Gonzaga University team beginning the "Big Dance" as the #1 seed in the West (and its first round game now under its belt) our Zags are the pride of the city and especially all of us GU alumni. I was able to go to one game this season, during the Christmas break when the students were out of town; it lacked the excitement of those nights when the Kennel is in full force (or so I'm told...never been to one myself!), but even at that, one could plainly see that this is an extraordinary team. The usual word that is used to describe this year's Zags is "selfless" and that is what I saw that night: a team that really is a team, all for one and one for all, no hot-dogs or the basketball equivalent of the prima donna. Sharing the ball and the baskets and the glory all around. *Cool.*



That kind of "selflessness" on the court is taught, nurtured, and practiced. It doesn't just happen. Families reinforce this element of character when their kids are still young. Coaches build on it and don't stand for anything less. Older players model it for the younger ones and show them how it is done. The end result: a *great* team because it is a *selfless* team.



It is good that we Christians, too, have this being modeled before us and that it happens right smack dab in the middle of our own spiritual version of "March Madness:" *LENT*. Lent is not a tournament by any means and it is not a sport either, but it is a special time set aside for learning, reinforcing, and practicing *selflessness* for us all. The humility and generosity that are the essential foundations of selflessness are qualities of character that need to be exercised regularly so that we can become really good at giving of self, putting others first, leaving egos at the door, sacrificing one's own pleasures for the good of others. These are the qualities of character that the Lenten season urges us to practice with renewed vigor, not for individual glory, but the glorification of all humanity and all creation, (made manifest, by the way, in the Resurrection feasts to follow).

It would be great if the Zags go all the way and at the end of March Madness are crowned national champions...but it would be far greater if we as a church could go all the way to the Easter and through our Christian selflessness gain for the world a greater share of the glory and life that is the Kingdom of God!
